Item I give unto THOMAS STONE the sone of RICHARD STONE the somme of £10 to be paid to him at the age of 21 years

Item My Will is that all the aforenamed gifts and legacies shall be paid unto the aforesaid parties within one yeare now after my decease except that which is given to THOMAS STONE aforesaid which is to be paid unto him at the age of 21 yeares as aforesaid

Item All the rest of my goods and chattels ungiven and bequeathed I give and bequeath unto ROBERT SEAVERNE my sone whom I make and ordaine my sole executor of this my last will and testament to see my legacies discharge and my funeral performed.
