In the name of God Amen I William Seaverne of the parish of Shrawley in the county of Worcester yeoman being sicke in body but of godd and perfect rememberance thanks be to God Do ordayne and make this my last will and testament in maner and forme followinge. Ffirst I give and commend my spirit into the hands of God my creator and redeamour, steadfastly beleavinge to be saved by the only merit death and passion of Christ my saviour and my body to christian burial where my friends shall appoynt. Item I give unto the parish church of Shrawley and to the poore of the same 12s whereof I give unto 3s 6d and 11d a house to the poore so far as the other 3s 6d will goe Item I give to my two sisters Anne Seaverne and Joane Seaverne five pounds. Item I give to my brother John Seaverne of Ridmarley in the parish of Great Witley 20s Item to my cousin John Seaverne 20s... Item to Margaret Seaverne widow late wife of Walter Seaverne (20s) 12s Item to Walter Seaverne the father of John Seaverne 12s Item I give and bequeath unto my brother John Seaverne aforesayd my cubbord Item I give unto my cousin John Seaverne my bed eyther this or the other at Bewdley whether he will choose Item I give unto my sister Anne Seaverne one coffer. The residue of my goods and chattles not yet bequeathed my debts legacies and funeral discharged I give unto John Seaverne of Ridmarley my brother and John Seaverne my cousin whom I ordayned and make my whole and sole executors of this my last will and testament.
