In the name of god Amen. Richard stone of Shrawley, the tenth day of February 1in the yeare of our Lord god 1642. being weake in body but of good & perfect memory all thanks be given to Almightie god therefore doe make & ordaine this my last Will & testament in maners and forme following videlict that is first & above all I bequeath my soule into the the hands of Allmightie god my creator trusting through the merits of Christ my redeamer to be found & my body to be buried in the churchyard of Shrawley in the County of Worcester as for those goods which the lord hath lent me. I dispose of them in maner & forme following.

Impri I give & bequeathe to my cousin Robert stone ten shillings to be paid presently after my decease likewise I bequeath to my cousin Christian STONE five pounds to be payed within a month after my decease. Item I give & bequeath to James Goodyeer - - ten shillings presently after my decease to be payed. Iten I give to Robert Weever & Thomas Hampton five shillings a peece to be payed presently after my decease. Item bequeath to my sister Elizabeth Longmore twentie shillings within a monthe after my decease, likewise I doe forgive my brother Robert STONE four pounds which hee oweth me part of it upon land, likewise all my household goods I doe give & bequeath to my cousin Robert stone aforesaid Item all the rest of my goods and cattles moveable and unmoveable I doe give & bequeath to my cousin Thomas STONE sonne of the forsaid Robert STONE senior whom I doe make my funerall expenses to discharge, all dues to me to receive sole executor of this my last will & testement And all of I doe appoint my loving brother -Robert Stone overseer of this my last will & testament to see every therein accomplished & donne according to the trew intent & invain herein. In witness thereto I have put to hand this day & year above written.
